#### PRAYERS FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH

**Pakistan:** Last year's devastating attack on the Christian community in Jaranwala was a sobering reminder of the hostile environment that Pakistani believers live in. This violence drew the world's attention – but Christians also face less obvious persecution every day.

"We are a lower class because we are Christians," says Rehena. She works long hours in a factory under poor conditions. Christians like Rehena are treated as second-class citizens in Pakistan, only offered jobs considered low and dirty. She says "we have no right to any privileges and have no right to dignity. It is an insult to Muslims to eat with us off the same plate. If we touch the plate, it becomes defiled." At the factory she has to keep her faith quiet. "It is dangerous to discuss my faith in Jesus, and we have to hide our identity, we cannot even say the name of Christ."

But Rehena is one of many Pakistani Christians remaining firm in her faith, despite what it costs her. "If I must choose between Jesus and a better life, the choice is not difficult," she says, "Jesus is the only way – this is what I cling to".

Let us pray with Rehena: Heavenly father, please watch over the 600,000 Christian women in Pakistan, who, like Rehena, work in poor conditions in factories. Keep their eyes fixed on you and show them your loving kindness. Protect and encourage all your children in Pakistan.
